How do you respond to the new things God is doing in your life, our church and the world? How do you react to change? Do you embrace it, believing that the Lord will successfully guide you, or do you simply tolerate it, reluctantly trying to adjust over time? Some people resist new experiences altogether, from pursuing a new job to moving to a different area. They may fear that having to think in new ways or do new things will disrupt their sense of security.

But our loving God of the past, present and future is constantly moving and revealing Himself in new ways. In fact, the Lord wants to change our



hearts and lives, and even our church for the better. So how do we, individually and as Christ's church, embrace the "new" that God has for us?

One way is to be will-ing to let go of the past, if it hinders us from being able to move forward. That may mean releasing certain expectations, desires, thoughts, behaviors, and even some people that negatively influence our lives.

Embracing the new also requires opening our hearts to what God's doing and seeing its potential. To some people, change is an unwanted visitor or

intruder. But when it is part of God's plan, it can become our best friend!

The prophet Isaiah's words above were spoken to a people in bondage. Many Jews were living in exile after Babylon conquered their nation. Some lost hope and faith. They did not understand that God was preparing to do a new thing: free them. As we approach the season of Lent, let's remember the "new" things God did through Jesus' death and resurrection. 
Initially, the group will meet once a week at our church and operate under Christian Education. Stay tuned for more information.


