-Psalm 100:2

These words from a beloved Old Testament psalm are both an invitation and a command. SPOTLIGHT Barbara Holmes

Barbara Holmes was born in 1929 in her parent's house in Pawtucket. She graduated from high school in 1947. This November she will celebrate her 90th birthday. Barbara's aunt, Gertrude Smith, introduced her to First Baptist Church. She attended FBC almost every Sunday from first grade through her high school years. Barbara still recalls being baptized by Rev. Prime in FBC's first building at the corner of High and Summer streets in Pawtucket. Years later she married John Holmes in the church chapel. Rev. Forrest Parsons officiated their wedding.

Barbara was active in several ministries at our church. She was a member of the former American Baptist Women's Group which supported missions projects, local and abroad. Barbara also helped plan a summer festival that raised funds for the John Clarke Retirement Home in Middletown, RI. She, her dear friend Maddy Ramos, and Louise Martin were in charge of the Baked Goods table there. Barbara also volunteered at FBC's Harvest Suppers and she helped at several Christmas Bazaars. In addition, she was a member of the Diaconate. She remembered that her experiences as a

deacon were not always serious; sometimes they were quite humorous. For example, one Sunday Barbara and Maddy were serving as ushers. At the proper time, they came forward to collect the tithes and offerings, but then realized they had left the collection plates at the back of the Sanctuary. Barbara chuckled as she recalled how the pastor prayed and prayed as she and Maddy ran back for the plates, then hurried to the front of the church. On another occas-ion, Barbara and a deacon visited Bill Wilbur, who was homebound at the time. They were about to serve him Holy Communion when they discovered that his dog (Betsy) had eaten the Communion bread!

Barbara has many fond memories of First Baptist Church. She hopes the congregation will be full again, especially with children and families. It saddens her that some children don't go to church any more due to sports games on Sundays. "I was brought up to 'Remember the Sabbath and to keep it holy," she said, quoting Exodus 20:8. "We went to Sunday School, church, had our Sunday dinner, and went for rides with our parents and friends." It was simple pleasures like this that added to her wonderful childhood.


